Welcome to Dance Kids' 26th Annual Performance of Nutcracker at Carmel's historic Sunset Center. We are so pleased that your young performer is returning or joining us for the first time. We've put this information booklet together for you in the hopes of sharing important production information with you prior to auditions, rehearsals, and our performances. While we've tried to be comprehensive, if you have any questions please don't hesitate to ask.

About this Year's Production

Returning this year, along with the symphony orchestra, Monterey County Pops! and the children's choir under the direction of Carol Frazier, is our Folklorico tour featuring local student dancers from the Monterey Peninsula. A new tour, Nutcracker: The Suite will feature Dance Kids performers in a shortened version of the holiday ballet. In addition, a new software tracking system will help track volunteer hours, providing much needed information for grants, and confirm just how many hours our volunteers provide towards Dance Kids programs.

About Dance Kids of Monterey County

"Giving children a better understanding of their world through the arts."

Dance Kids of Monterey County was founded in 1993 as a non-profit organization dedicated to bringing opportunities in dance and theater to the youth of Monterey County. Our mission is to strengthen character and positively influence children's lives through the performing arts. We seek to fulfill this mission through our various programs, including our annual Nutcracker performance, Cascanuaces: A Folklorico Nutcracker, Nutcracker: The Suite Tour, Rhythm Works Integrative Dance for students with special needs, and Dance Kids Teach for afterschool dance classes.



About the Monterey Pops!

Monterey County Pops! was founded in 1985 and not only provides to the community free, public pops-and-patriotic concerts on holidays, but is the only orchestra in Monterey County that provides a tuition-free, professional performance experience for disadvantaged students in their own communities.

The 2019 season features 175 young, underserved performers in collaboration with the orchestra to create seven professional-quality performances. Over 6,700 audience members enjoyed these performances.

Medical Release and General Waiver

This is a release and waiver of liability for administering medical treatment (hereinafter, referred to as the "release"), by and between Dance Kids of Monterey County, Inc. ("Dance Kids") and

By signing this release, I authorize any representative of Dance Kids to arrange for medical services for my child should such Dance Kids representative (in his or her sole discretion) deem such services immediately necessary. Such Dance Kids representative shall have the authority to take my child to an appropriate hospital emergency room, doctor's office or care facility, so that my child may receive immediate treatment or care.

By signing this release, I authorize that said representative of Dance Kids, emergency facility, hospital, doctor, or paramedic shall be authorized to perform any and all medical and surgical treatment, x-ray,

laboratory, anesthesia, and any other medical or hospital procedures as may be deemed necessary for the care of my child.

I further authorize that in case of an allergic reaction any representative of Dance Kids shall be authorized to administer medication specified by my child's physician. I release and forever discharge Dance Kids and its employees or agents from any liability arising in law or equity as a result of Dance Kids' or its employees' or agents' administering epinephrine and providing other emergency care in conformance with the child's medical exam forms, provided that Dance Kids has used reasonable care in administering epinephrine and in providing other authorized care in accordance with the medical exam form.

In consideration of my child's participation in Dance Kids' 2018 Nutcracker program, rehearsals, performance or other related activity (the "Program"), I hereby irrevocably and unconditionally release and discharge Dance Kids, its affiliates, parents, and their owners, directors, officers, board members, agents, employees, volunteers, representatives and affiliates (collectively, the "Released Parties"), from any and all actions, causes of action, claims, demands, liabilities, obligations, lawsuits, rights, costs and expenses whatsoever, including without limitation reasonable attorney's fees and costs (collectively, "Claims"), in any way arising from or in connection with or relating to my child's participation in the Program including without limitation as a result of any medical treatment administered in connection herewith.

I further acknowledge that I have read and understand Section 1542 of the Civil Code of the State of California, which reads as follows: "A GENERAL RELEASE DOES NOT EXTEND TO CLAIMS WHICH THE CREDITOR DOES NOT KNOW OR SUSPECT TO EXIST IN HIS FAVOR AT THE TIME OF EXECUTING THE RELEASE WHICH IF KNOWN BY HIM MUST HAVE MATERIALLY AFFECTED HIS SETTLEMENT WITH THE DEBTOR."

I, for myself and on behalf of my heirs, successors, assigns and representatives, hereby expressly waive and relinquish all rights and benefits under Civil Code Section 1542 and any law or legal principle or similar effect.

This release shall be governed by the laws of the State of California, which is the location of the Dance Kids facility in which the child is enrolled, excluding its choice of law provisions. The reference in this release to Dance Kids shall include the Dance Kids, its affiliates, successors, directors, officers, employees, and representatives. The term Parent/Legal Guardian shall include the dependents, heirs, executors, administrators, assigns and successors of each.

By signing this release, I hereby acknowledge that all medical information submitted to Dance Kids will be shared with appropriate Dance Kids staff and other medical personnel in the event of treatment for my child.

I hereby release Dance Kids, its employees, agents, representatives and board of directors from any and all liability and claims in connection with this authorization and shall take no legal or other action against Dance Kids or such individuals in connection with obtaining or administering emergency medical treatment for my child.

A photocopy of this authorization shall be deemed effective as if it were an original. This authorization shall remain in effect until January 30, 2020.

Fee Information

Like many other performing arts non-profit organizations, ticket sales for Dance Kids' Nutcracker only cover about 40% of production costs. Putting on a high-quality show at the fabulous Sunset Center requires us to raise funds beyond our ticket sales. We do this through corporate sponsorships, grant writing, program ad sales, our auction, and fees. We are working to reduce performers' fees, but we still need fee income to meet our costs of production.

This year the fees for performers are:

Audition Fee: \$25 for Dancers only

Production Fee: \$395

Production Fee (ages 6 and under, one part, or choir part): \$200

Production fee includes costume cleaning at the end of the performances.

The audition fee is due at the time of audition on **August 18, 2019**.

The production fee for performers is due by **October 15, 2019**, but we encourage families to pay the fee as soon as possible. Please make checks payable to Dance Kids of Monterey County. Checks may be mailed to **Dance Kids of Monterey County**, P.O. Box 6225 Carmel, CA 93921. Dance Kids has a mailbox inside the Carmel Academy of Performing Arts; payments can be left with the CAPA clerk on duty.

Credit card payments can be accepted by visiting the Nutcracker page of the Dance Kids website. www.dancekids.org.

Scholarships: We never want financial need to prevent our young people from performing in Dance Kids' Nutcracker. There are a limited number of financial need scholarships available. To apply for a financial need scholarship, please mark the appropriate box on the application, and we will send you a scholarship form to complete and return. Financial need scholarship forms are due by September 15, 2019.

MPC Registration

One source of funding is a grant from the State of California through Monterey Peninsula College. We can receive a stipend for each performer grades 6-12 that has not previously participated in the specific MPC course. Our funding is based upon the number of MPC students registered. There is a short-required meeting with the MPC representative that eligible middle school students and one parent must attend. Dance Kids will notify eligible students and provide the necessary MPC Forms. New this year will be the ability to partially register on line. Regardless of paper or on line registration, forms need to be signed by a school principal or designee for those in Grades 6-12.

Our goal is to receive completed MPC forms and registration on all eligible students. Thank for you for helping secure this additional funding.

Rehearsals

In all styles of dance, repetition is the most critical thing to learning a piece. For a dancer to remember the steps and master the natural look of the movements there is nothing more effective than repetition and rehearsal. When dancers repeat movements over and over, motor memory kicks in and forces muscles to perform tasks without the brain having to work on overload.

In *Nutcracker: A Monterey Tradition*, our choreographer and rehearsal directors have a very clear image of what their piece should look like and the messages to be sent to the audience. Attending scheduled rehearsal is critical to the success of the performance and to ensuring our audiences enjoy the beauty of our dances. Rehearsal time is when our dancers perfect the steps, work on technical execution and combine their creativity with their fellow dancers. We want our students and parents to know that while long hours may be required for rehearsals, it is always for the benefit of the dancer and an essential part of a dancer's education. We expect our dancers to not miss rehearsal, to be on time, and to be respectful to teachers, fellow dancers, and parent chaperones.

Rehearsals will begin immediately and run through the performance dates. The choreography will be set at different times for the various parts by each Rehearsal Director. Most of the choreography will be done during the first few weeks.

Performers will be excused for illness and extenuating circumstances on an individual basis. Please indicate on the audition form if you plan to be out of town or already have commitment for weekend (Fri-Sun) from September through the performance. **Because rehearsals are so critical to the success of the program, performers with 3 unexcused absences may be dropped from the production at the rehearsal directors' discretion.**

Punctuality is vital. Please arrive 15 minutes ahead of rehearsal call time. Be dressed in proper attire including hair, allowing for personal warm up.

Please check in with your rehearsal director upon entering the rehearsal space. Dancers 10 and younger must be checked in and out by a parent or guardian. Older dancers may check themselves in and out unless we are directed otherwise. Dancers may not leave the rehearsal site during rehearsal time without written permission of a parent and must be accompanied by a buddy.

Please bring snacks and plenty of water for the rehearsal period.

The Children's Choir during the Snow Scene continues under the direction of Carol Frazier. **For those students who desire to perform both as a dancer and singer, it would require no dancing parts during the Snow Scene. The vocalists will be fitted for a costume.**

Choir Vocalists register and pay thru Dance Kids. The registration forms are the same for dancers and vocalists; and all Dance Kids policies apply. Choir rehearsals are Tuesday afternoons 5:30pm-6:30pm at CAPA inside Studio C.

The Choir is expected to perform not only in the Nutcracker show, but also before each show, and at the Nutcracker Gala held on Saturday Dec 14th. Other performance opportunities will be presented during many of our mini performances and tours.

Nutcracker, The Suite will show case members of the Nutcracker 2019 cast performing an assembly style show to elementary children in the Salinas Valley during the week of Nov 11th.

Cascanueces: A Folklorico Nutcracker will show case our local Folkloric Dancers trained by Jorge Palacios; performing four traditional dance styles from four Mexican states with a live mariachi accompaniment. Folklorico Dance rehearsals take place bi weekly at CAPA on Wednesdays from 3:30-5:00pm and Saturdays 8:30-10am. Performances will be during the week of Nov 18th at local schools and locations in the Monterey Peninsula.

Schedule

Below is a limited schedule that provides the general rehearsal times. It is our intension to provide schedules in 4 week intervals for a total of 16 weeks.

This is our best estimate at this time and may be subject to change. A more detailed schedule will be available at auditions.

All rehearsals for dancers and actors, choir, and Folkorico, except for tech week, take place at the Carmel Academy of Performing Art, 8th & Mission, Carmel, CA.

Costumes

A costume is provided for each part in which the performer is cast.

Costume Fitting: Joanne Phelps and her team of volunteers will fit and alter all costumes. Costume fittings will be held during a scheduled rehearsal period for that scene. Please do not miss rehearsals or costume fittings.

Dress Rehearsals and Performances: The performer and/or his or her parent must make sure that the costume and all accessories are at the theater, clean (costumes are issued clean), pressed (if needed), and ready to wear for all performances. It is a good idea to come to the theater prepared with safety pins and a needle and thread. Performers may not eat, drink, or apply makeup while in costume unless the costume is protected by a smock, big shirt, or other means.

Performers are responsible for providing their own shoes, tights, and make-up. A complete list of requirements will be provided after casting. Female dancers should bring at least two pairs of tights in case of runs or tears. Shoes should be clean and in “new” condition.

To preserve the magic of the stage, we ask that costumes not be worn to or from the theater and that performers refrain from being in the lobby during intermission while wearing a costume.

Immediately following the last performance, costumes (including headpieces) will be collected at the Sunset Center by the costume team, unless the dancer is participating in the Carmel Valley Ranch show on December 22, 2018. Performers in the Carmel Valley Ranch show should turn in their costumes immediately following the show.

Dance Kids will clean all costumes.

Family Volunteer Policy

We need you! To produce a high-quality production, we not only need a talented cast, but also a great group of parent/guardian/family volunteers. You help make this show successful! **We have a variety of opportunities to fit different schedules.**

We believe that performing is a vital part of a dancer's education. Dance Kids of Monterey County provides this experience for all the young people that audition for Nutcracker. It is an enormous undertaking and requires many hours of rehearsal on the part of the dancers as well as hundreds of hours of volunteer support behind the scenes.

We need every family to volunteer to help with some aspect of the performance. There are many kinds of jobs to be done; with everyone's help we have fun and are able to put on a smooth performance. Each family is expected to help by volunteering for **twenty hours**. There are many opportunities to help for the entire family; older siblings with experience in baby-sitting can help during rehearsals as well as grandmothers or grandfathers that can sew! Be an involved and creative family!

The information contained in this booklet is meant to make the first-time performer feel as comfortable as the "veterans" who have danced in many productions. We have great shows and want everyone to have a wonderful experience with Dance Kids of Monterey County. It is important to us that everyone from the smallest mouse to the Sugar Plum Fairy learns and expands their skills as a dancer through performance. Thank you for your patience, your understanding, and your cooperation—it is only with your support that we can achieve excellence.

We do allow families to "buy-out" of their volunteer obligations by paying \$400, but we much prefer that your family help in making the Nutcracker an amazing experience for performers and audiences alike.

New this year is the addition of a software program which allows administration to track volunteer hours. Volunteers will log their hours on line; the only requirement for this software is internet access. Hours can be logged by cell phone or computer.

Volunteer Opportunities!

Graphic Artists: Do you have skills in the graphic arts? Can you create posters, postcards, signage? Let us know, we've got jobs for you! Time commitment varies.

Costume Assistants: Costumes are critical to any performance and each year our costumes must be fitted to performers in new roles. That means a lot of stitch ripping, hemming, crafting and more! We need help with sewing, crafting, and organizing tasks. Even if you don't have sewing experience there are still things you can help with in the costume department. Costuming typically takes place on Sunday afternoons from 1-5pm at the Dance Kids Office at the south end of the Sunset Center. There are also opportunities for responsible teens who are interested in earning community service hours.

Rehearsal Assistants: It is not all about the show! To create an amazing final production, our performers put in a lot of rehearsal time. Because we have many young people participating in our performance, we need volunteers to check performers in and out of rehearsal and to help watch our little ones during down time. There are lots of spots available, which makes it easy to fit this job into any schedule. This is also a great opportunity for responsible teens to earn community service credit.

Parent Performer: Do you like to dance? Do you like to be on stage? You can fulfill the family volunteer commitment by being a parent performer!

Party Coordinators and Assistants: If parties are your thing, then we've got some great opportunities for you. As part of our fundraising efforts, Dance Kids hosts two great events during the performance weekend—The Gala and the Sugar Plum Fairy Party. Most of the work for these positions happens prior to the performance and is generally flexible. But, we also need people to help set-up and break down the party room (Studio 105 at the Sunset Center). Party assistant is another great opportunity for responsible teens to earn community service credit.

Tech Week and Performance Volunteers: The show will not go on without you! Families can give all their volunteer hours helping backstage during Tech Week and during performances, or families could commit just some of their hours. The reality is that we need a small army of volunteers backstage to make the performances run smoothly. We need people to man the stage doors, supervise our younger performers in the dressing rooms, help with quick changes, assist with props, and check performers in and out. There is just so much that goes on behind the scenes. Unlike some other positions that span several months, these opportunities all take place within a one-week time span. Stage hands are still another opportunity for responsible teens to earn community service.

Auction and Program Ad Assistants – About 1/4 of our funding for the production comes from our silent and live auction fundraiser and our program ads. We need six to eight people willing to work with the auction coordinator and the program ad coordinator to reach out to local businesses for auction items and ad placements. We are also hoping to brainstorm creative ideas for live auction this year. Program ad work is generally completed by mid-November. Securing auction items commitments is also completed by November, but additional help is needed collecting the auction items, setting up for the auction, collecting payments and distributing items.

Even if this is not your choice of volunteer jobs, if you know any local businesses that would be interested in donating or placing an ad in our program book, please let the coordinators know.

MPC Coordinator: We need someone with strong organizing skills to coordinate the MPC process. The position involves sending out MPC forms to eligible performers, arranging and attending the one-hour meeting with the MPC representative, compiling attendance records for eligible students, and collecting all completed forms.

School and Nursing Home Outreach Coordinators: Do you believe that both young and old should have an opportunity to enjoy the performing arts? Dance Kids does a number of special performances at several nursing homes on the peninsula. We need someone to help coordinate these performances, which includes outreach to local nursing homes, scheduling, and attending the performances, which will be scheduled for November 3, 2019.

Secondly, we need someone to coordinate our school performance on December 13. The children that attend this program come from schools where the majority of students receive free or reduced-price school lunches. It may be one of the few opportunities these children have to see a live ballet. This volunteer needs to follow up with our contact at Monterey Peninsula Unified School District, reach out to other schools to the extent additional space is available, and be on site before and during the school performance.

Load-in & Strike: What would a performance be without props and stage equipment? We need approximately six people to dedicate 3-4 hours to help load-in and strike the equipment at the Sunset Center.

Load-in: Tuesday, Dec. 4 (time TBA, but usually in the morning)

Strike: Sunday, Dec. 9 (immediately following the show).

Administrative Assistant: Do you like numbers and spreadsheets? Do you know (or are you willing to learn) Quickbooks? We need one such person to help track payments and deposit checks.

Gift Sales Assistants: Prior to and after performances and during intermissions, Dance Kids sells various holiday gift items, including Nutcrackers! We need a few people to help with gifts sales.

Wild Card: Don't know exactly what you want to do but are happy to help wherever needed. You're a wild card, and we need you. We are happy to discuss a volunteer position that best fits your schedule and skills. We also need people willing to cover volunteer slots on a last-minute basis.

Auction, Program Ads, Fundraising, Marketing, and Sponsorships!

The success of Dance Kids depends on our ability to fundraise. Unfortunately, ticket sales cover only about 40% of our production costs. Consider helping Dance Kids by spreading the word about the Nutcracker to potential attendees, identifying businesses to be sponsors, to be auction donors, or to place an ad in the Nutcracker program. And, of course, consider and encourage others to think about Dance Kids when they are making charitable contributions.

Marketing: We encourage everyone to help us promote the show by distributing marketing materials at your place of business, school or other locations. Postcards will be available at the rehearsals. Please distribute them by hand or send them to people who might be interested in seeing Nutcracker. Posters are available upon request to info@dancekids.org.

Dance Kids will post marketing information regularly to social media sites. If you use these sites we ask that you “like” or share the posted information so that it will reach a wider audience. Auction Items, Program Ads: About one fourth of the funds for the Nutcracker comes from our live and silent auction and revenue generated from our program ads.

Andrea Paris (Choreographer) — Guitierrez was selected as the choreographer for the 2015 complete remount of *Nutcracker* for Dance Kids of Monterey County. She holds the British Ballet Organizations Solo Dancer's Diploma. Andrea trained on Full Scholarship at the New Zealand School of dance before joining the Royal New Zealand Ballet. Andrea toured the US and Canada with the National Touring Company of *Sugar Babies*, *Song of Norway*, *Anyone Can Whistle*, *Anything Goes*, *My Fair Lady*, *Pajama Game* and more. She choreographed and performed with Opera Pacific and the Los Angeles Opera. She coached Fred Savage on *The Wonder Years*, Rita Moreno for PBS, and Tony Geary on *General Hospital*. She choreographed the award-winning video for the rock/punk band Jane's Addiction. In 1992 Andrea opened the Los Angeles Ballet Academy and has been the Artistic Director for 24 years. She holds the Royal Academy of Dance Teacher's Certificate. Andrea has been awarded Outstanding Choreographer at Company Dance and the Youth America Grand Prix and the Outstanding Teacher of the Year award from *Dance Teacher Magazine*. Andrea lives in Lake Balboa with her husband Iker. Their son Dylan is a member of the Joffrey Ballet Company and their daughter Veronica is a freelance dancer with MTA Agency. Sandra Burnham — British born Sandra Burnham has 50 years' experience as a professional dancer, teacher and examiner of classical ballet. After a season as a teenager with the Royal Ballet's "Ballet for All" program, she grew too tall for corps work and became a member of the world famous Bluebell Girls troupe in Paris for seven years. She also worked as a Parisian high fashion model. Moving to New York, she worked in haut couture modeling and then as a NBC-TV production assistant, whilst continuing her ballet training at the Youskevitch Studio. Marrying and returning to her native England, she opened and ran her own highly successful ballet school in beautiful North Yorkshire for twenty years, during which time she became an international ballet examiner for London's Royal Academy of Dance. She has taught and examined in Ireland, Spain, Portugal, Greece, Germany, Mexico, Brazil, Shanghai, Hong Kong, the Caribbean, Canada and the United States. Settling back in the States in 1998, she has mounted productions of *Graduation Ball* in England, GA, FL and MD and of *The Nutcracker* in CA, as well as teaching summer schools, intensives, and coaching for Youth America Grand Prix (YAGP). Her teaching is noted for its careful combination of technique with interpretation, and for her disciplined care for and compassion with her students.

Gloria Elber — Gloria is legendary for her choreography and directing of the stage and musicals on the Peninsula. Gloria is a dancer, teacher, director and choreographer. She has worked with most of the theater groups on the Peninsula and was the choreographer for the Gold Medal, USA Olympic team in synchronized swimming. Most recently, Gloria directed Carmel's Centennial Celebration Parade with over 700 participants.

Philip Pegler (Artistic Director) — Philip was born in Westow, England and began his study of Classical Ballet with his mother at the age of five. At the age of eleven, Philip was accepted into the Bush-Davies School, where he trained until the establishment's closure in 1989. After further training at The Vaganova Academy in St. Petersburg he joined The Legat School before accepting a full scholarship to study at The Harid Conservatory in Florida. In 1991, Philip returned to England and was offered a place at The Royal Ballet School in London. He became the School's Head Student in 1994

and graduated with the School's Teachers' Training Course Diploma in 1995. Although initially employed as Company Ballet Master and Soloist Dancer with the Columbia City Ballet, Philip has dedicated much of his career to the education and training of students. He became the Artistic Director of the South Carolina Dance Theatre in 1996 before joining the Calvert-Brodie School as Director in 1998. In 2002, Philip was appointed to the position of Assistant Professor in the College of Theatre and Dance at the University of Florida, where he taught Classical Ballet and lectured in Dance History. Philip was appointed to the Board of Vocational Examiners of the Royal Academy of Dance in 2005; a position that ultimately took him to five of the world's six continents. In 2008, he returned to live in England, where he joined the faculty of Elmhurst School for Dance in Birmingham. Philip was subsequently elected to the Board of Trustees of the Royal Academy of Dance and has continued to work as a Freelance Teacher, mentoring students and teachers in both the private and vocational education sectors.

Carol Frazier (*Choir Director*) – Carol Frazier is a renowned composer, songwriter, jazz recording artist, actress, vocal and artist development coach, author and speaker. Frazier is known for her world jazz fusion, swing, and smooth jazz styles. She performs to varied audiences; music festivals, theaters, churches to film, TV and videos.

Her creative work has spanned from five original music albums to compositions for film, TV, shorts, music videos, and musical theater.

She has performed for international audiences for more than 20 years, from the U.S., London, Canada, Italy, South Africa, to South America. "Life's A Ride" was internationally distributed with The Butterfly Group out of Nashville, Tennessee. Her song, "Never Let It Happen Again," is performed in the 2016 feature film, "The Intervention" written and directed by Clea Duvall ("Veep"). Her musical, "Simple Baby Boy" has been performed both in the United States and Israel.

Frazier has headlined, opened or performed with renowned artists such as Patti Griffin, Sister Sledge, Loverboy, Don Grusin, The Bruebeck Brothers, The Fort Collins Symphony, Nelson Rangel, Darren Rahn, Eric Gunnison, Tower of Power, and more.

Jorge Palacios - Jorge Palacios was born in Durango, México, graduated from High School, and moved to United States in 1970. He is a graduate of San Jose State University in 1977 and began teaching Baile Folklorico at Alisal High School in Salinas from 1981-1999. He joined Los Lupeños de San Jose Co. from 1984-1994, as a member for the oldest Mexican folk dance company, and taught Baile Folklorico as part of the High School Curriculum at W. C. Overfelt High School in San Jose from 1990-1999. He continued to teach Baile Folklorico as part of the curriculum at Everett Alvarez High School in Salinas from 1999-2016. Jorge Palacios has received numerous recognitions from many groups and institutions, such as Danzantes Unidos, East Side Union High School District, Salinas Union High School District, Los Lupeños de San Jose Co., Hoxipilli Dance Co., San Jose State University, and La Academia de Danza Mexicana.

Cascanuaces: A Folklorico Nutcracker

For the past five years, Dance Kids of Monterey County has toured an original production, *Cascanuaces: A Folklorico Nutcracker*, in schools located in the Salinas Valley. This year Dance Kids brings the production to the Monterey Peninsula. The performance includes nine mariachi musicians performing Tchaikovsky's masterpiece composed in Hispanic sounds by Salinas-born, Jalisco harpist William Faulkner. Folkloric dancers perform four traditional, and very different, dance styles from four different Mexican states. Joining with a mariachi version of the Sugar Plum Fairy solo, a traditionally costumed Dance Kids' ballerina performs in traditional tutu. Dance Kids also provides collateral teaching materials to schools in order to explain the performance, the musical instruments and the traditional ballet story. Over the past five years, Dance Kids has performed this program for more than 2500 children.
